Many of the well known department stores in Wales are closing their doors. The most well known of these is B J Jones of Lampeter. It has been in the same family for eighty years, having been founded by the father of the present owner, Mr. Bernard Jones. This store has built up a very strong reputation for quality merchandise. Shoppers drive miles to visit, from England and Wales. Shoppers are not only from the U K but Europe and further afield from Toronto and other parts of Canada. Many people from around the world are familiar with B J's. Their bi annual sales draw very large crowds and the merchandise is all sold in no time at all.

Other stores with historical backgrounds have close in the last few years. David Evans of Swansea closed after 140 years of trading. Cardiff City centre no longer has David Morgan, after celebrating its 125<sup>th</sup>,

anniversary it to closed down. In Llanelli Pugh brothers will shut after 112 years of service.

Kerfoot's in Porthmadog, founded in 1874 as a family business is now an independent store.

**Cornel Fach Y Gegin**

**Our Kitchen Corner**

*Frances Loaring writes that "Neath market" always had a reputation for the very best faggots and peas. Here is a recipe adapted for us in North America by Audrey Collins Author of "O Gornel y Gegin—From The Kitchen Corner"*

***Ingredients.***

*½ a loaf of stale bread. 1lb calf's liver. ½ lb of beef, ground chuck. 1 ½ lbs onions. 1 heaped teaspoon sage crushed. Salt and pepper to season.....*

***Method.***

*Convert bread into breadcrumbs in a blender. Pass the liver through a grinder (or the next best thing!), followed by the onions. If you wish, get your butcher to grind the liver for you. Mix all the ingredients together and form into balls about 2 inches in diameter. Flatten and place in a well greased oven proof dish or roasting pan. Cover with greased foil. Bake at 350 to 375 F or 180 to 190 C. Gas mark 4 or 5. Brown (Takes about an hour)*

*This tasty savoury treat is truly traditional, yet perfectly complements the modern lifestyle. Faggots are easily and quickly made, and once cooked, may be frozen for later use as work-place lunches warmed up in the microwave.*

Help Required Please

As you know we have a choir from Wales coming over for the Festival in Stratford April 29 - May 1, 2005. We are expecting quite a large crowd this year and require 300 dozen Welsh Cakes for the Welcoming Reception and the Te Bach.

If you are able to make Welsh Cakes, could you please contact Trisha Stevenson at 905-884-2603 (evenings) or 416-291-8158 (daytime). These will be required by April 27, 2005 and should be sent in Tupperware containers with your name clearly marked on the container. These may be frozen until required.

*Trish asked me to include a recipe for those not sure of how to make Welsh cakes. This is an old tried and true one that has been around Dewi Sant for years. The ONLY mistake that you can make is overcooking.*

\*\*\*

6 cups Robin Hood flour—all purpose; 2 cups sugar; 1½ cups raisins; 1 teaspoon nutmeg-grated; 3 teaspoons baking powder; 6 beaten eggs; 1 teaspoon milk; ¾ teaspoon salt ; 1 lb. butter—unsalted; 1 teaspoon grated onion rind.

Method

*Sift flour, baking powder and salt together. Rub in the fat until mixture looks like 3 fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar and fruit and the rest of the dry goods. Lightly beat the eggs and add the milk. Stir into the mixture.*

Roll out into ¼ inch (7½ cm.) rounds. Cook on a greased surface, ie hot griddle, frying pan or one of those electric breakfast trays that will make at least 2 dozen at a time. Bake until light brown then turn and bake the other side to a light brown. Put them on a wire rack to cool, sprinkling with castor sugar as you do so. Stack them on top of each other as they like to complete cooking in their own heat. Store in an airtight containers.
