VIEW FROM THE LORDS - Lord Roger Roberts

The year end is the time for reflection and for looking forward to 2007. But first of all I would wish all who read these words a very happy Christmas and a peaceful and constructive new year.

In Parliament the Government of Wales Bill became law and in the coming year will give the National Assembly more opportunity to serve the people of Wales. It will be up to the Assembly to make the most of its additional powers, especially for all who have wanted a stronger Welsh language act. Because of, primarily, the efforts of Labour Peer, Lord Gwilym Prys-Davies and as a Liberal Democrat I was delighted to speak in support, there is a full opportunity for the Assembly to enact a more effective and fair language policy.

Two other measures were approved in the year, first of all that which established a Commissioner to ensure that our Older People are not unfairly treated in any way. The Transport Wales Act should ensure greater co-ordination of road and rail transport in Wales. One of my responsibilities is as a spokesperson in the Lords on Welsh affairs, the other is to speak and act on International Development.

My main concern has been with the treatment of people abroad and in the United Kingdom. On a number of occasions we have debated modern-day slavery and people trafficking. It is estimated that about 4,000 women are trafficked into the United Kingdom every year, in addition children are also brought here and both categories are in grave danger of abuse of every kind. The last day of the autumn session I was successful in receiving a pledge from the government that they will sign and ratify the United Nations Convention to safeguard Children from trafficking and they also will publish, in January, a Plan on the issue of Trafficking of adults and children. The Council of Europe Convention would strengthen Britain's commitment in these matters and I will continue to press with others of all parties that this Convention be signed.

It is always a pleasure to welcome people to Westminster. I have hosted two choirs. The Burlington, Male Voice Choir from Ontario, Canada were singing at the Albert Hall as part of massed Welsh Choirs - 15 all together. A great evening. Many of the choristers I knew from my time as Minister in Toronto.

The other choir was from Kampala, Uganda, the Watoto Children,s Choir of 18 orphans of Aids victims. They were superb and the whole visit was very moving. The children sang in the Parliament Chapel and then had a great tea in the Lords main dining room. It was a day to remember.

Finally a little name dropping! I had a chat with the King of Jordan when he paid us a visit! That's Parliament . One day we host some of the most deprived children in the world and the next day we are in very different company.

The House of Lords debated Modern day Slavery on Tuesday, December 19. **Roger Roberts** (Lord Roberts of Llandudno), Liberal Democrat overseas development spokesman stated-

"I am pleased that in yesterday's debate on modern-day slavery that the government promised to sign the protocol on the UN Convention on the Rights of the child that deals with sexual exploitation of children and publish their Action Plan on Human Trafficking in the new year.

We still wait for government signing and ratifying the Council of Europe Convention against human trafficking. There was amongst those who spoke 100% agreement on this. The government must not drag its feet any longer"
